



LOOKING BACK ON 2020

The numbers, charts and lists skim the surface of a year that challenged us in ways we never imagined. We also adapted and grew in response to that challenge.

Navigating a Pandemic

Our direct care staff provided support for hundreds of individuals around-the-clock throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. We developed new ways to deliver services remotely, keeping consumers as active and engaged as possible.

Growing through Mergers

Easterseals Arc merged with Angola's RISE Inc. in July 2020, expanding the services available in Steuben County as Easterseals RISE. A merger with Passages in Columbia City was announced in December 2020 to expand services in Whitley County as Easterseals Passages.

Rethinking Fundraising

Dancing with the Arc Stars had to be canceled, disappointing the dancers who had worked so hard to learn their routines. Culinary Queens shifted to a virtual format, with a smaller number of Queens doing their best to fundraise online. But, individual donors made Giving Tuesday 2020 our best ever, and generous grants helped bridge a larger than usual funding gap created by decreased revenue and increased expenses throughout the pandemic.


