
Structured Family Caregiving • Trained caregivers welcome individuals with disabilities to live in their home and integrate them into their family life.


Respite • Breaks for caregivers to reduce stress and improve social and emotional health for the whole family.


Martha's Story

Looking Back on 2021

Continued Growth • The Easterseals Arc merger with Passages Inc. that was announced in December 2020 became official in March 2021, expanding the services available to people with disabilities in Whitley County. The Easterseals Passages community now has new clubs and activities; a wide range of employment services; behavior consulting; and Pre-Employment Transition Services for teens. In July 2021, Easterseals RISE opened an office in Auburn to provide employment services, Transitions, and respite in DeKalb County. Easterseals Arc also formally aligned in June 2021 with Cardinal Services in Warsaw to form Easterseals Northern Indiana, a network leveraging shared resources and expertise to expand and enhance the supports available for individuals and families throughout the region.

Employment Pathways • Understanding that employment builds confidence and self-esteem, in addition to providing income, Easterseals Arc continued to develop employment pathways to help individuals with disabilities find their fit in the workforce. Some of the innovations include arranging paid work experiences for students in Pre-Employment Transition Services; developing workshops on neurodiversity in the workplace; establishing a new Employment Readiness Academy at the Whitley County Family YMCA; helping local employers alleviate labor shortages through supported work groups; and developing industry-focused learning labs.

Community Focus • An AWS Foundation Vantage Grant awarded in August 2021 will allow Easterseals Arc to increase its focus on community inclusion and ensuring access to support services for people with intellectual or developmental disabilities throughout northeast Indiana. With this funding, Easterseals Arc created new community inclusion staff positions dedicated to providing person-centered, community-based services. That team already has created hundreds of opportunities for individuals to pursue their personal interests and dreams. The funding also supports expansion of respite, employment, and other services in Whitley and Steuben counties.
